## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## Transfiguration, Lent, and Easter

It's almost March and almost Lent, but not quite. This Sunday, February 27, we will join James and John on a mountaintop, dazzled by Jesus transfigured before them and speaking with Moses and Elijah. We'll hear the words they heard spoken from a cloud: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Luke 9:34 says they were terrified at being overshadowed by the cloud, but it must also have been an exhilarating experience.

So different from the prolonged, steadfast perseverance of Lent. In his hymn text, "'Tis Good, Lord, to be Here" (LBW 89), Joseph Armitage begins each stanza quoting Jesus' disciple Peter on the Mount of Transfiguration, saying to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here!" (Luke 9:33). The final stanza is:
'Tis good, Lord, to be here!
Yet we may not remain;
But since you bid us leave the mount,
Come with us to the plain.
It's a plea to Jesus to walk with us from the mountaintop of Transfiguration to the plain of Lent, and from the mountaintop of Sunday worship to the plain of weekday work. And though Lent is not my favorite season of the year, and work is not my favorite activity, life on those plains is good. God goes with us, and gives us Lent and work for our good. The weekday disciplines of Lent cultivate in us an eagerness for Sundays each one a little Easter. They make us more aware of our sin - of how easily and subtly we become attached to God's good gifts and turn them into idols. They remind us, in the words of Martin Luther, that "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Matthew 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Not of misery and self-loathing, but of day-by-day putting on our Baptism and returning to the Lord.

The disciplines of Lent give us a sense of solidarity with Christians around the world who routinely suffer for their faith. They deepen our consciousness of our depravity and increase our gratitude for Jesus' humility, suffering, death, and resurrection for our sake. They help us to appreciate God's gift of time, as we look forward to Easter and to our own resurrection from death. And that time will come! Moving from Lent into Easter reminds us that God walks through life with us, and will at last bring us home to him. Jesus will return in glory to make all things right, and so we live each day in hope. As the apostle Paul encouraged the Corinthians:

The symbol in the upper left corner expresses by means of candle and messianic rose the worship of the Messiah and the Truth of Christ. The cross signifies His central deed and the five crosses in the rose the sacred wounds.

So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison (2 Corinthians 4:16-17).

Knowing that the Lord is with us, I look forward to walking with you on our pilgrimage from the Mount of Transfiguration to the plain of Lent, up the hill of Calvary, and into the sunny uplands of Easter.
